The 2024 Festival will feature some of the brightest stars in storytelling, including Michael Reno Harrell, an award-winning North Carolina singer-songwriter known for his "Appalachian grit and wit"; Megan Hicks, an internationally acclaimed storyteller who is at home in an impressive array of stories, from fairy tales to personal narratives to ghost stories; Nestor Gomez, an immigrant who came to the U.S. in the 1980s, learned English, and overcame a stutter before going on to win more than 75 Moth Story Slams; Anne Rutherford, an electric performer whose funny and touching stories, singing, and mandolin playing have enchanted audiences across the country; and Len Cabral, the great grandson of a Cape Verdean whaler whose African, Cape Verdean, and Caribbean folktales take listeners on unforgettable journeys. Performances by our featured tellers will enrich and educate listeners of all ages, and workshops will enable festival-goers to claim their own voices and become storytellers themselves.

The GMSF will bring attention to the strengths of our mountain setting, highlighting the traditions and beauty of the Southern Appalachians. It will introduce our region to many outsiders, who will then connect to this place and return in the future, benefiting our local communities economically. Additionally, participation by local schools, libraries, churches, and businesses will make this a rich opportunity for all of us. We are excited to host an activity that can mobilize and strengthen these community partnerships.

Most importantly, the festival will connect our past with our future. The festival is free for students 18 and under to encourage young people to embrace and participate in the legacy of telling their own stories and the stories of their region.
